The mission of the South Florida Cancer Association (SFLCA) is to assist South Florida cancer victims and their families. The SFLCA provides assistance with information, referrals, treatment costs, and transportation for treatment.

To assist us in meeting our goals, the SFLCA partners with over 110 national, state, regional, and local organizations dedicated to providing cancer treatment and research. The SFLCA heads the Risk Reduction Workgroup of the Southeast Florida Cancer Control Collaborative, one of four state collaboratives working with the Florida Department of Health to see the State Cancer Plan to successful fruition. The collaborative is sponsored by the University of Miami Healthcare System. The SFLCA actively participates in the South Florida Community Cancer Council and is a member organization of the Lifeline Transportation Coalition (a membership of national and local organizations, and government agencies dedicated to ensuring cancer patients procure transportation to and from treatment). Our director is the South Florida facilitator for the American Cancer Society for this program. Our organization is also represented on the board for the International Relay for Life in Fort Lauderdale as well as the Monroe County, Florida Local Coordinating Board for the Transportationally Disadvantaged.

The figures to the left were supplied by the Florida Department of Health, Division of Disease Control, Bureau of Epidemiology and the Florida Cancer Data System. Although there are 67 counties in the state of Florida, the 4 counties of Broward, Miami-Dade, Monroe, and Palm Beach account for over a quarter of the new cancer cases and cancer-related deaths each year in the State of Florida.



Although our staff is entirely volunteer, in 2008 the SFLCA reached over 5,000 South Floridians providing information and much-needed assistance. The SFLCA anticipates that number to exceed 10,000 in the coming year and to double that in the year following.
